However, considering the nature of service being solicited it is proposed to exclude this certification from minimum eligibility criteria. Bidder who possesses CMMI Certificate will be given due weightage at the time of Technical Evaluation. The Service Provider should at least possess ISO 27001:2013 certificate and also please refer to the corrigendum.

Hence, we request this clause to be removed.

The Process is well oiled that there happens to be absolutely zero mix ups. While this is so To give an example, The exercise done by M/s. Tata Consultancy Services for the on screen marking in Goa School Board backfired very badly due to the time taken and errors that were seen. Whiles some local players recommend book scanning to push their product, We being a gobal company does not recommend book scanning.	We operate across the country, giving the On Screen Marking Solutions both for Universities and Public Service Commissions. Hence the process that is defined to scan the answer booklets is key to the success of the exercise. Moreover, a technology that is implemented should be cost effective and also seamless in terms of operational aspects. The Solution implemented by We is used for On Screen Marking world over @ 120 universities around the globe. 7	Clause 3.1.10 & Page No. 18		Scanning should be done without cutting the spine of the Answer Booklet by employing the Book Scanners. The indicative number of Answer Booklet shall be 1, 00,000 for a particular year. All the pages of the booklet should be accounted for and identified with the booklet ID number. Document scanner with ADF (Automatic Document Feeder) are not allowed for scanning.	Without cutting will slow down the entire process even for a relatively small size of digitization requirement of IMU; The concern of booklets being cut and consequently mix up of images within a booklet and between booklets is effectively addressed by a simple and unique ID marking process of TRS. So, digitization by cutting booklets can also be considered.	Tender condition prevails

8	3.6.1	Scanned Images moved through Computer media	Scanned images are directly uploaded to the Data Center Server. Usage of Pen Drives, Hard Disks and other media to store scanned images is a serious security threat and We refrains from this practice. 9	3.6.3 Uploading of Answer scripts to a dedicated server in a LAN	Clause no: 3.6.3	This is against the industry practice. We uploads the answer booklets into a dedicated Ttee - 3 data center for the reasons cited below: 1. Every activity including the CoE and whoever who is accessing the server shall have to be monitored through the log files. 2. Every activity done in a day shall be replicated in the local server in IMU CoE, Headquarters. 3. Maintaining the Log Files in the Local Server on the LAN gives absolute access to do manipulation in the server and also. Same is the case with the Local Server on the respective locations. 4. Live monitoring and control will not be practical and possible for the CoE to speed up the evaluation if in case it is slow. 5. Compromises such as changing the marks and awarding higer marks etc has all happened with some of the implementations with our competition with some of the clients also.	Anna University is a classic case. The systems and process were not established In such a manner that the element of compromise is arrested then and there. Fundamentally, the software is so programmed to set a threshold of answer booklets. For Example in a forenoon session, an evaluator cannot evaluate more than 20 answer booklets. Accordingly the evaluator's bucket would be filled with 5 answer booklets at a time * 4 times. If in case the evaluator falls short where in he/she evaluates only 15 then 15 becomes the measure of the efficiency of the evaluator.		Tender condition prevails
